

- Interested in engaging schools and networking with resources for support.
- · Keen learner who values self-initiated work.

Please Note: The age limit is flexible, but those between 20 and 35 years of age will be preferred.

Details of the 10-week Orientation Programme:

With the above objectives in mind, the 10-week orientation programme will include the following:

- Learning about the 25 session Climate Action and Nature (CAN) syllabus for classes 6/7.
- Understanding methods of learning, teaching and facilitation.
- Understanding the personal transformation needed to be a Nature Educator.
- Learning about the importance of Field Trips,
 Learning Partnerships and Community
 Interaction.
- Learning to use books, magazines and videos effectively.

What Does the Teach for Nature Fellowship Involve?

- 1. 10-Week Orientation Programme: Starting May 20th, 2024, embark on a transformative journey at the Bhoomi Campus. The orientation programme is free, with a nominal refundable deposit.
- 2. 8-month Work Placement: Become a Nature educator in 6th/7th grade in select schools from August 1st, 2024 to March 31st, 2025. Receive a stipend and ongoing support.
- 3. Weekly Mentoring: Benefit from online or in-person mentoring to enhance your skills and learning experience
- 4. Continued Impact: Extend your journey beyond the Fellowship by continuing as a Nature educator in subsequent years.



Structure of the Orientation Programme:

The TFN Fellows will be given a kit that includes the detailed syllabus, sample lesson plans, a book and reading material and links to videos, etc.
